The society approached our Division Executive a number of years ago asking if they could transfer the remaining funds to our Division "IN TRUST". The purpose of this is to ensure that there are sufficient funds to pay for the maintenance of the Memorial as well as pay for any further maple leaves should any other members be lost in the line of duty. Your Executive supports this initiative, and we are working to set up a Trust Account at the bank to handle these funds. These funds will be protected to prevent them from being used for any other purpose than those stated above.

Finally, I want to wish Gord Cave every success in taking over the helm of the Division. I will be around as the immediate Past President to assist in any way possible/required.

# MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT-ELECT:




Good day to you all. I wish you the peace of the season and my hopes of health and happiness for the coming new year.

The attached PDF documents # 1 # 2 which were distributed with the November newsletter for the information of all the members and their families. There have been several instances where a member has passed away and the family is left with no information regarding his/her benefits, pensions and other necessary material. In some cases, the spouse/partner is no longer capable of accessing this information, due to ill health or age. In these circumstances, it becomes most difficult for those who are left to deal with the estate to follow up with benefits, taxes and other requirements.

You may or may not chose to complete this document (#2) as a reference for your spouse/partner or any particular designated member of your family. This is only a suggestion as sometimes circumstances dictate problems that we do not anticipate.

<u>EXAMPLE:</u> Member in good health and spouse/partner in Care facility in poor health. Member is handling all finances, banking, day to day operations of residence. Member has a stroke, incapacitated or unfortunately passes away and family is now left to sort out the estate, pensions, follow up care for spouse/partner. Unless you have account numbers, policy information, contact #'s, these institutions are never ready to provide you with any of this information. In some cases, Financial institution will not even acknowledge that there was an account with them. Of course, "Power of Attorney "covers these issues, if the information is readily available.

The information document is provided to complete as a guide and suggestion only to do as you wish.

# **APPEAL ON BEHALF OF AN EX-MEMBER'S SON:**



Vancouver Division Life Member, Bill Craig has requested that the following message be circulated to our membership:

My Son -in-Law is Al Dodson who married my daughter, Kathy. Al worked in E Div. and while in Langley was the victim of a drunk driver who went through a stop sign and T boned Al's PC and severely damaged his hip area. He was eventually granted a medical discharge. He did not join the Vets because he became allergic to anything which had flour in it and he could not eat the meals at the

meetings. Al's son, Geoff is married and has a wife and three young daughters. He lives in Abbotsford and is an employee of Telus. He has very recently been diagnosed with a rare type of cancer that has no cure available in Canada or the USA.

One of his sisters has set up a Go Fund me site seeking donations because he will likely have to go to Germany where the only known treatment is available. The estimated cost of doing this is not covered by our health service and is estimated to be \$100,000.00. More info is contained in the Go Fund Me material.

#### **VAC DISABILITY PENSION APPLICATION PROCEDURES:**



The following information bulletin was received from RCMPVA National Office:

Dear Members of the Association,

There is currently work being done on our Guide to Health Benefits and Services (formerly the Advocates Manual) by Lethbridge Division Secretary, Mike Duffy in conjunction with Chief Advocate, Ruby Burns.

As a bit of a teaser to the revised guide we have been provided with a "cheat" sheet by Sgt. Kim Hendricken that provides some basic requirements for obtaining VAC assistance.

It will give you a bullet-style information guide prior to the publication of the larger document by Secretary Duffy. It will be handy as a quick reference sheet.

The "cheat sheet" follows.

VAC (Veterans Affairs Canada) Disability Pension Application Procedures You must have a medical diagnosis of a disability condition and you must show how your service in the RCMP caused, aggravated, or contributed to your disability.

Create a My Vac Account. All serving or released Regular and Civilian Members are encouraged to create a MY VAC ACCOUNT. (Google it) Within your My Vac Account, go to Forms and complete and submit the Application for Disability Benefits (PEN923AP) online through this account. VAC will send you a medical questionnaire, instructions on where your doctor should send the completed questionnaire, and fee payment details for completing the questionnaire.

If you need help with completing your application, you can contact your local RCMP Vets Association Advocate, Legion Service Officer, or a Disability Benefits Officer at VAC at 866-522-2122 (eng) 866-522-2022 (fre).

If you want to add additional pages to your application, you can upload and send them through My Vac Account under Upload Files on the Homepage.

If you want to contact VAC about any questions you may have, you can go to Contact VAC and send a secure message through your My Vac Account. The common categories for questions are noted in a drop-down list.

Review all of the possible benefits available to you through your benefit browser in My Vac Account.

If you want to give VAC consent to speak to your spouse or family member on your behalf, please ensure you complete VAC520 and submit it electronically to VAC through your My Vac Account.

NOTE: In the past, many members have paid their dues at Division functions, such as luncheons, however because of COVID 19, this is not currently possible. At this time, we would prefer that you use Option 1 or 2 as Option 3 is not fully operational until January 2021 or later. We will notify you once this system has been implemented and tested. # **PENSION INDEX RATE - 2021:**

The indexing rate for 2021 is 1.0%.

The indexing of public service pension plan benefits is governed by two pieces of legislation; the *Public Service Superannuation Act* (PSSA) and the *Supplementary Retirement Benefits Act* (SRBA).
